Responding to your suggestions

As a matter of priority on return to school in September **all students** received Teams guidance sessions at school. Students are also continually reminded at school about how to access resources and told of any updates or changes.

Students are also informed of the information that has been uploaded to the school website, should they forget what they need to do.

Responding to your suggestions

Parents/carers are communicated with via the **school comms app**, please check these regularly.

If you are concerned you are not receiving these correspondences please **contact reception** to check your details are correct, or for help setting up the app.

Students are following their **normal timetable** when working remotely so should not need a reminder or prior warning as to timings of lessons.

Responding to your suggestions

Currently our resources are uploaded as PDF documents, it is intentional that you **cannot edit** these. This has been done in order to prevent student misuse. Students are to use a separate document or their jotter to complete the work set.

Students who are isolating for a week or more will be set additional **assignments** to complete, allowing them to submit their work and for staff to provide feedback.

Responding to your suggestions

Again as a priority an audit was taken at the beginning of the year (September) to address device accessibility. Devices are being allocated accordingly if students find themselves having to isolate.

If your student is still without a device they must report this to learning managers immediately for it to be dealt with.

Moving forward

As you are aware, remote learning is new way of teaching for us at Rossington All Saints Academy. We know that over time our provision will only continue to develop and strengthen, for that to happen we require your continued support.

With any update on remote learning both students and parents/carers will remain informed. We ask that you talk with your student(s) about Teams regularly to ensure they know what is expected, should an isolation occur.
