A few classroom basics to help you



Pen- Use an appropriate pen for writing

Ruler- Underlining titles or use for drawings

Oops- Looking for mistakes

Underline- Underlining titles

Draw- Use a pencil for drawing



SLANT is the acronym for how we expect you to behave in all your lessons. It stands for:

Sit Up

Listen

Ask questions

Nod

Track the speaker

Questioning

Students are not expected to put their hands up to answer questions, in fact we have a rule that they should not do this. Instead, the teacher will decide who answers questions by targeting a wide variety of students during the lesson. This ensures that students remain focussed as they could be asked a question at any point in the lesson. We often use random name generators that select the students for us.

Hands Up

When you see the teacher's hand raised:



- 1) Raise your hand.
- 2) Give the teacher your full attention.
- 3) Signal anyone not raising their hand.

While students do not raise their hands to answer questions, they will raise their hands when they are expected to be silent and focused on the teacher. When teachers require silence and focus from the whole class, they will raise their arm. All students should follow the teacher and copy them, once everyone has followed this the lesson will resume.
